			thinking skills. Students will also strengthen their ability to identify themes, infer meanings, and respond effectively to textual information.
4	July	Deep Water A Thing of Beauty Invitation Writing Case Based Factual Passage	- Students will learn the importance of determination, courage, and self-confidence in overcoming fear and challenges. - They will appreciate the role of beauty, nature, and art in bringing joy and inspiration to human life. - Through Invitation Writing, learners will acquire skills in drafting formal and informal invitations with accuracy and creativity. By solving case-based factual passages, students will enhance their ability to interpret, analyze, and evaluate factual information while improving logical reasoning and comprehension skills.
5	August	The Rattrap Indigo A Roadside Stand Letter to Editor Report Writing	- Students will understand themes of kindness, compassion, redemption, leadership, and social reform. - They will analyze the struggles of rural communities and understand socio-economic disparities between urban and rural life. - Through literary analysis, learners will appreciate Gandhian principles, human values, and the importance of empathy in society. In writing tasks such as Letter to the Editor and Report Writing, students will improve their formal writing abilities, organizational skills, and ability to present opinions, arguments, and events effectively and systematically.
